First Item: General Executive Council Minutes - Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. stated he would entertain a motion to approve the minutes of May 17, 2022 and Executive Session Minutes on May 17 and June 23, 2022 as submitted by Adjutant-in-Chief Dan A. McCaskill. ANV Commander R. Kevin Stone made a motion to accept the minutes as submitted by the Adjutant-in-Chief. The motion was seconded by Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White. Hearing no discussion, the motion passed without objection.

Second Item: Update on the Reunion: presented by Georgia Division Commander Tim Pilgrim and Chief of Protocol Chuck Rand. Georgia Division Commander Tim Pilgrim presented Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. a Reunion Medal for his wife, Lynda, who was unable to attend because she is recovering from a recent illness.

Third Item: Update on 2023 Reunion: Arkansas Division Commander Loy Mauch gave a brief report on the 128th National Reunion to be held in Hot Springs, Arkansas.

Fourth Item: 126th Reunion Business Minutes: Adjutant-in-Chief Dan A. McCaskill reported the General Executive Council voted at its October Meeting to approve the Reunion Business Session Minutes and there was no further action by the General Executive Council however the Minutes had to be ratified by the delegates assembled in Reunion to make them official.

Fifth Item: Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget - Executive Director Adam T. Southern reported that the Budget and Finance Committee met to discuss the proposed Fiscal Year 2022 Budget and voted to recommend that the General Executive Council approve the budget for approval by the Reunion delegates. After a brief discussion, Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made a motion that the General Executive Council recommend the budget as presented to the Reunion for ratification. The motion was seconded by ANV Commander R. Kevin Stone and the motion passed without objection.

Sixth Item: Potential Litigation: Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall gave a brief introduction of a case being considered by the Georgia Division that does not involve any SCV member but the effect would have a broad effect concerning the display of the Confederate Battle Flag. The basic facts of this case are attached to these minutes in the form of an email from Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall. Scott introduced the primary litigator, Martin O'Toole who would explain the case. Mr. O'Toole explained the case in some detail and also reminded the General Executive Council that his presentation was for the GEC's information and that no funds would be requested at this time. If the case moves forward, this will be re-addressed before this body.

At 2:52 PM EDT, Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked for a motion for the General Executive Council to go into Executive Session allowing Executive Director Adam Southern and Chief Investigator Kenneth Ramsey to remain to discuss disciplinary matters. Lt. Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers made the said motion for the Council to go into Executive Session. The motion was seconded by Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White and the motion passed without objection.

At 3:33 PM EDT, ANV Commander R. Kevin Stone made a motion for the General Executive Council to exit Executive Session. The motion was seconded by ATM Commander J. C. Hanna and passed without objection. The General Executive Council heard the report on one case currently before the Disciplinary Committee and briefed on four (4) pending cases. Also, discussed was potential disciplinary action against another member and the resolution of a non-disciplinary case.

Lt. Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers reported that if he is elected Commander-in-Chief, the next General Executive Council Meeting will be October 1, 2022 and the spring meeting will be the first weekend in March, both at Elm Springs.

AOT Commander Jimmy D. Hill gave a quick report concerning the "Story Line" in the Confederate Museum. He will be offering each Division of a Confederate State, Border State and Territory the opportunity to submit two soldiers to go on the "Wall of Honor". Commander Hill had the panel for one of the submissions from the Tennessee Division to show what will go on the wall. The Museum Committee will be asking for submissions to honor the "Common Soldier" with a bio on the soldier

At this time, there has not been a bid submitted for the 2025 Reunion.

Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. gave his closing remarks thanking the members of the General Executive Council for their service and support during his term as Commander-in-Chief.

With no other business coming before the Council, Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Past Commander-in-Chief Charles Kelly Barrow and the motion passed without objection.

First Item: General Executive Council Minutes - Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. stated he would entertain a motion to approve the minutes from March 5th to present as submitted by Adjutant-in-Chief Dan A. McCaskill. Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made a motion to approve the minutes as submitted by the Adjutant-in-Chief. The motion was seconded by AOT Commander Jimmy D. Hill. During the discussion, Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall recommend changes. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott Hall said he would send the objectional language to the Adjutant-in-Chief for deletion. Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. amended his motion to adopt the minutes with the recommendations of the Judge Advocate-in-Chief. The motion passed without objection.

Second Item: Permission for Legal Action - Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. reported that the Joseph E. Johnston Camp # 28 in Nashville is asking for permission to intervene in a proceeding of the Nashville Parks and/or the Tennessee Heritage Historical Commission in the name of the Sons of Confederate Veterans for "standing" to have a legal voice in the movement of the Confederate Monument in Nashville to ensure the monument is moved and not destroyed by the city. The Camp is not asking for any funds. Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made a motion to allow the Joseph E. Johnston Camp #28 to intervene against the City of Nashville. The motion was seconded by ATM Commander J. C. Hanna. The motion passed without objection.

Third Item: Request for Events at Elm Springs - Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. surrendered the floor to Executive Director Adam T. Southern to present his request. Adam reported there would be two events held on the grounds of Elm Springs. First would be an Antique Car Show with an expected cost of \$250 for a couple of port-a-potties. Second would be an Antique Market Place with an anticipated cost of \$2,500 which has been offset by a sponsors check for \$2,500. These events would cost very little for the SCV but could generate a significant amount of money for the Confederate Museum. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall made a motion to allow these events to be held on the grounds of Elm Springs. The motion was seconded by Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. The motion passed without objection.

Fourth Item: Update on Camp 215 Issues - Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. reported at the Red Carpet Event, the film uncovered several additional missing artifacts. Letters had been sent to Camp 215 and Lee Millar concerning these artifacts which will be returned to the Confederate Museum but would cost us \$1,400 to have the items transported to us. Commander McCluney wants to get as many of these missing items turned over to the Museum before proffering charges against Lee Millar. The needed funds to transport the items will come from the excess Forrest Reinterment Funds and identification of a company to transport the items is being investigated.

Fifth Item: Disciplinary Case from Florida - Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. wanted the GEC to be aware of a future disciplinary case coming from Florida. The Florida Division is in the process of expelling a member from their Division on charges of embezzlement. The member has admitted to embezzling money from his Camp, of which he has repaid some. The Division will probably proffer charges in the near future to have the member expelled from the Sons of Confederate Veterans, Inc.

At 7:25 PM CDT, Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked for a motion for the General Executive Council to go into Executive Session allowing Executive Director Adam Southern to remain to discuss a disciplinary matter and a membership issue. Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made the motion for the Council to go into Executive Session. The motion was seconded by Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White and the motion passed without objection.

At 8:15 PM CDT, Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White made a motion for the General Executive Council to exit Executive Session. The motion was duly seconded and passed without objection. At 7:25 PM CDT, Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked for a motion for the General Executive Council to go into Executive Session allowing Executive Director Adam Southern to remain to discuss a disciplinary matter and a membership issue. Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made the motion for the Council to go into Executive Session. The motion was seconded by Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White and the motion passed without objection.

Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. gave the floor to Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall.

The first item: The Footman Camp in Ft. Myers, Florida requests permission pursue litigation against the City of Ft. Myers, Florida for removing the bust of General Lee without following proper city protocol and without authority. There is no request for money. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall made a motion to grant the Footman Camp permission to pursue litigation against the City of Ft. Myers. The motion was duly seconded and passed without objection.

The second item: Louis Foley Disciplinary Action – Mr. Foley claims he has never received a letter from the Disciplinary Committee of the charges proffered against him. Mr. Foley alleges he received a letter addressed to Louis Foley, Jr. who is deceased. It has been confirmed the initial letter to Mr. Foley was lost by the Postal Service and the second letter was addressed in error. The question is whether to proceed with the Appeal Hearing set for in July knowing Mr. Foley, Sr. will use the mis-addressed envelope issue to get his expulsion overturned or whether to send the matter back to the Disciplinary Committee, resend the letter stating the charges again and giving Mr. Foley, Sr. another opportunity to address the charges negating the mis-addressed envelope issue. The Judge Advocate's recommendation and motion is to return the issue back to the Disciplinary Committee for further evaluation. The motion was seconded by Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. The motion passed without objection. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall will contact Disciplinary Chairman Frank Heathman, Foley's attorney and the MS Division Commander to inform him what the issue is and Adjutant-in-Chief Dan A. McCaskill will mail the letter proffering charges addressed to Louis Foley, Sr. by certified Mail, signed receipt requested.

The third item: Stephen Homewood – Mr. Homewood did not agree with some articles printed in the Confederate Veteran Magazine and resigned his Life Membership. Mr. Homewood has demanded a refund of his Life Member dues of \$300 or threatened that he will sue the SCV in the courts of Florida. The Judge Advocate stated the legal fees would greatly exceed the \$300 and he would pay the \$300 for Mr. Homewood to go away. The Judge Advocate's recommendation and motion is to refund the \$300 from whatever available source and have Mr. Homewood sign a release of any claim against the Sons of Confederate Veterans. The motion was seconded by Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White. The motion passed with a vote of 12 Yeas and 1 Nay.

At 8:15 PM CDT, Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White made a motion for the General Executive Council to exit Executive Session. The motion was duly seconded and passed without objection. The General Executive Council decided to re-send the letter proffering charges against an individual member and also voted to refund a disgruntled Life Member his Life Member dues after his resignation to avert possible litigation.

At 7:06 PM CDT, Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked for a motion for the General Executive Council to go into Executive Session allowing Executive Director Adam Southern to remain to discuss disciplinary matters. Chaplain-in-Chief Dr. W. Herman White made the motion for the General Executive Council to go into Executive Session. The motion was seconded by ANV Commander R. Kevin Stone and the motion passed without objection.

Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. reported that Chief Inspector Kenneth Ramsey informed him of a situation in North Carolina that involved a Camp Commander by the name of David Leslie Hoover who had been arrested for stabbing a co-worker after a heated argument and has been charged with a felony. Eric Previti was directed by the CIC to place Mr. Hoover on temporary suspension pending the outcome of the case in North Carolina.

Louis Foley Case: Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. gave an updated report on this case. As directed by General Executive Council, a third letter was mailed to Mr. Foley stating the charges proffered against him and giving him up to thirty (30) days from the date of the letter to respond was mailed by certified mail, signed receipt requested by Adjutant-in-Chief Dan A. McCaskill. This was done to assure Mr. Foley due process. The 30 days has expired with no response from Mr. Foley. Since there has been no response from Mr. Foley, there will not be an

appeal hearing at the Pre-Reunion General Executive Council Meeting in Cartersville. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall was asked to comment of this case. Scott Hall affirmed the CIC statements and added that he sent a letter to Mr. Foley's attorney containing the same letter mailed to Mr. Foley plus informing the attorney that Mr. Foley was given an additional 30 days to respond to the charges to ensure Mr. Foley has been given due process. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall stated there was no admission of wrongdoing on the part of the General Executive Council or the Disciplinary Committee. The Disciplinary Committee would take action as they see fit and proceed from that point. With any recommendation of the Disciplinary Committee, Mr. Foley will be sent a letter of that action and given 30 days to request an appeal.

Randell S. Bender Case: Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. gave an updated report on this case. Mr. Bender has been charged with embezzling Camp funds. Mr. Bender has been expelled from his Camp and the Florida Division has expelled him from the Division. The Florida Division has proffered charges against Mr. Bender with the CIC who has forwarded the charges to the Disciplinary Committee who is now investigating the case. A letter from the Disciplinary Committee informing Mr. Bender of the charges and his rights has been mailed to him by certified mail, signed receipt requested by Adjutant-in-Chief Dan A. McCaskill.

Lloyd Tilgham House Update: Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked Lt. Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers for a report on the Tilgham House situation. At the Kentucky Division Reunion, Lt. Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers asked a question concerning a post on Facebook stating the Camp in Paducah would no longer care for the Tilgham House and would turn the house over to the Kentucky Division. This may have been a political ploy to see how involved the Division would become in the care for the home. He was assured that the Paducah Camp would continue to care for the home.

Mississippi Division Constitution Issue: Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. gave a report on the recent Mississippi Division Reunion where again amending portion of the Constitution concerning Penalties and Due Process as directed by then Commander-in-Chief Tom Strain were again thwarted by the same person and faction that has stood against this procedure for the past six years based on a formatting error as specified in the Constitution. AOT Commander Jimmy D. Hill commented on the proceedings as he witnessed and felt this was a prearranged effort. Commander Hill has been in communication with Mississippi Division Commander Conor Bond. Commander Bond plans to call a Special Reunion to deal with this issue and hopes to have it rectified by September 15, 2022, a date suggested by Commander Hill. Commander Bond stated should the Constitution is not fixed at the Special Reunion, if the Division Charter needs to be suspended to send a message, suspend the Charter. Commander Bond is requesting a strong letter from the General Executive Council addressed to the MS Division expressing the need to fix the Constitution. Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall to word a strong, specific letter addressing this issue to include September 17, 2022 as the deadline to Commander Bond of the seriousness of this issue for distribution to their members. Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall stated he would do so.

In further discussion, ANV Councilman Christopher M. Sullivan stated in his opinion the failure to amend the Division Constitution was not a serious enough action to warrant suspension of a Division Charter. It was directed by Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. that Dan McCaskill forwards a copy of the Mississippi Division Constitution and the proposed amendments to ANV Councilman Christopher M. Sullivan and Judge Advocate-in-Chief Scott D. Hall for further investigation for clarity in the issue at hand.

Forrest Artifacts: Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. reported National has all known artifacts in their possession or will shortly. Attorney Ed Phillips has sent a letter to Lee Millar stressing the coin in questions needs to be returned to National. The Tennessee Division is considering bringing charges against Lee Millar after all artifacts are returned to National. Additional money raised by Camp 215 has not been sent to National nor has there been an accounting thereof. Need to contact the Camp Commander for an accounting of these funds and have the funds sent to National which will be designated for the re-erection of the Forrest Statute.

At 8:05 PM, CDT, Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made a motion for the Generals Executive Council to exit Executive Session. The motion was seconded by AOT Commander Jimmy D. Hill and the motion passed without objection.

Museum Update: Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. asked AOT Commander Jimmy D. Hill to give a brief report on the Museum. Commander Hill reported the Timeline has been developed through the Battle of Manassas. Work is being done two days a week instead of one and by the end of next week should be finished with another wall. Have installed three video monitors with power point presentations being played on each monitor. There will be two more monitors installed. People who go through the museum are reading all the story boards and the feedback has been very positive.

2022 National Reunion: Many of the events and tours have been sold out. There are a few tickets available for the Banquet.
