First Item: Minutes - Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers stated the General Executive Council would be voting to approve the minutes at the Pre-Reunion and Post-Reunion General Executive Council Meetings.

Commander Boshers entertained a motion to approve the Pre-Reunion Meeting Minutes. Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made the motion to approve said minutes. The motion was seconded by AOT Councilman Carl Jones. With no discussion, the motion passed without objection.

Second Item: Email Widget - Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers turned the floor over to Lt. Commander-in-Chief W. Donald Kennedy and Chief of Heritage Operations James Ronald (Ron) Kennedy to talk about the Email Widget. The Email Widget is a device which allows you to send information to your Senators, Representatives and other concerned parties. This device was borrowed and used as test run with the Arlington Confederate Memorial Issue. This user-friendly device gets emails out quickly but the members need to use it. Commander Kennedy is hoping for feedback from the members to see if it would be worth purchasing the complete package for use by the Confederation.

Chief of Heritage Ops James Ronald (Ron) Kennedy gave a briefing on Heritage Operations and an update on the Stephen D. Lee Institute. The group who has the widget is called "One Click Politics" and Mr. Kennedy plans to send each member of the GEC a link to this site so they can schedule a demo of the widget for them to evaluate. The cost of the Widget is between \$3,000 to \$5,000 plus someone at Headquarters will have to set the program up and administer the program. The program is user friendly and can be used by all Divisions in the Confederation.

The Stephen D. Institute will be in Tampa, Florida and Dave McAllister is overseeing the program. The dates for the Institute are set for February 24 – 25, 2023. Topic to be announced.

Third Item: Investment Committee - Commander-in-Chief R. S. Fifth Item: Fiscal Year 2022 Operating Budget - Executive Director Adam T. Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. gave his closing remarks thanking the members of the General Executive Council for their service and support during his term as Commander-in-Chief.

With no other business coming before the Council, Past Commander-in-Chief Paul C. Gramling, Jr. made a motion to adjourn. The motion was seconded by Past Commander-in-Chief Charles Kelly Barrow Jones and the motion passed without objection.

Second Item: Press Officer Issue - Commander-in-Chief R. S. Jason Boshers stated with the discussion at the Friday Business Session concerning a Press Officer, this is a position to seriously consider. The Commander asked the members of the General Executive Council to think on the position of a Press Officer and present their ideas at the upcoming GEC Meeting in October. Also, take a look the Public Affairs Manual.

AOT Councilman Carl Jones pitch his ideas for a Press/Public Relations Officer. First, look inside the organization for a member with experience and willingness to perform in this position. Second option is to recruit someone fresh out of college who we could groom as an officer in this position. Plus, you need an advertising campaign to bring in new members and bring back old members.

Past Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. made a motion to table the issue and take up the issue at the next General Executive Council Meeting in October. The motion was seconded by AOT Councilman Carl Jones and the motion passed without objection.

The motion was seconded by ATM Commander J. C. Hanna and passed without objection.

Southern to remain to discuss disciplinary and other sensitive items. At 3:48 PM EDT, Past Commander-in-Chief Larry A. McCluney, Jr. made said motion. Lt. Commander-in-Chief W. 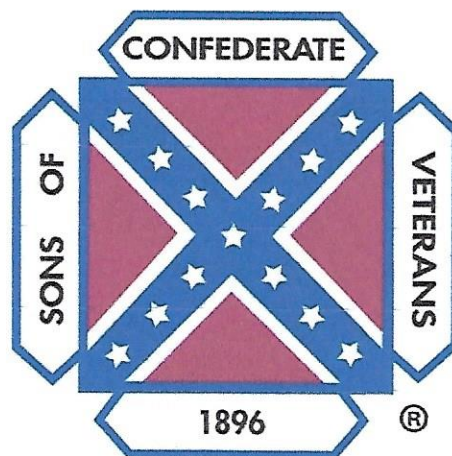

The Incivility of Woke Politics

The Sons of Confederate Veterans (SCV), established in 1896, is America's oldest veterans' organization. The SCV is outraged that the federal "Naming Commission," established by Congress in 2021, has now recommended to Congress that the Confederate Memorial located in the Confederate Section of Arlington National Cemetery be removed. A key member of the Naming Commission previously published a highly critical book about Confederate General Robert E. Lee. This individual is not a neutral member of the Commission. His unwarranted vitriol directed toward the South and the millions of Southern Americans whose ancestors served honorably in the Confederate military has tainted the entire process.

The Commission itself fails to recognize that the Confederate Memorial at Arlington was sculpted by Moses Jacob Ezekiel, a Jewish American sculptor,

and Confederate Veteran. The memorial was dedicated on June 4, 1914, as part of America's continued effort to reunify the United States in the post-war era. Unfortunately, the Naming Commission has seen fit to recommend its removal and therefore the desecration of this honorable grave marker. This is an unmitigated attack on Southerners who have provided, in terms of percentage of the country's total population, more recruits to the American military than any other region of the nation.

This recommendation is divisive and extreme, and it epitomizes the complete lack of respect for the over 400, Confederate service members, their wives, and Confederate civilians buried at Arlington. Further, it will likely undermine the security and safety of Confederate memorials in every cemetery in America as well as the graves of Confederate Veterans, who are also American veterans, as enacted by Congress in 1958. The Sons of Confederate Veterans will work diligently to push back against the Naming Commission and fight against other Machiavellian proposals that continue to divide our nation. We urge all patriotic Americans to contact their representatives and senators and voice opposition.
